### Air Travel

New York City is serviced by:

- [LaGuardia](#) Airport (LGA) approximately 11.2 miles and 20minutes driving
- [John F. Kennedy](#) Airport (JFK) approximately 18.9 miles and 30minutes driving
- [Newark](#) Airport (EWR) approximately 17miles and 35minutes driving.

### Train Travel

#### Port Authority Trans-Hudson (PATH)

There are five subway-style “PATH” stations along Sixth Avenue -- 33rd Street, 23rd Street, 14th Street, 9th Street, and Christopher Street. Trains from all of those stations run to terminals in either Hoboken, Jersey City or Newark, New Jersey. Transfers are also available to these points. These stations connect with 10 New Jersey Transit commuter lines that serve New Jersey, as well as Orange and Rockland County, New York. #### The Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA)

The MTA operates Long Island Rail Road (LIRR), and Metro-North Railroad. The LIRR system stretches from the eastern tip of Montauk, Long Island to Penn Station in Manhattan, approximately 120 miles away.
